

Modern Slavery Act 2015: Slavery and human trafficking statement.

INTRODUCTION

This statement is made to comply with section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps the CIPP will take in order to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not taking place in our supply chains or in any part of our business.

ORGANISATION

The Chartered Institute of Payroll Professionals (CIPP) is the Chartered association for payroll, pensions and reward professionals in the UK. With more than 12,000 individuals benefitting from the CIPP's membership and education services, the Institute is dedicated to raising the profile of the payroll in business across the UK and internationally.
